



#### **DATA SURVEY**

A **repository** collecting the **data** gathered during the project **survey** 

At this moment, the **surveys** are **ready** and **34/50** filled questionnaire were collected.

When the task will be completed, **UC Leuven** will start to **analyze** the collected data and **ITD** will **publish** it on the **HUB**.

#### **MATERIALS**

A space where the experts of the partnership can spread high quality materials or good practices worth of mention about behavior management models or techniques

A new section on the HUB could be an aggregator of articles worth of mention about the management of problem behavior at school.

We ask each scientific partner to find 3/4 articles worth of mention on the Internet to be published on a new section of the HUB.

Users of the HUB will be able to propose new interesting URLs to increase the collection prepared by partners.

#### **INFO DESK**

An **information desk** where the trained teachers can stay in touch with their trainers getting **feedback** and **suggestions** from them about how to transfer in their school environment what they have learned during the training courses



Teachers involved in the training program will use the HUB during the remaining training courses in UK, RM, and BE to collect their experiences at school about the application of the strategies to manage undesidered behaviours.

In UK, teachers will describe a case study, and will be supported to define an intervention plan according to the knowledge acquired during the courses.



Group consisting of a referent teacher for each school involved in the project. He will have the responsibility to guarantee the completion of the task by the teachers before attending the next training program in UK.





#### [READ BEFORE POSTING HERE] How to write my case study? was created by merlo

The "Case Studies" category of the forum is meant to provide the trained teachers of the BEHAVE training courses with a virtual space where they can structure and share the case study on which they want to work. Each teacher involved in the training will add a topic here about a student with problem behavior. Then, during the courses, the trainers will revise some cases for each school team and will provide them with suggestions to define an intervention plan that will be carried out with the support of the BEHAVE application. At the end of this process, data gathered with the BEHAVE application could be anonimously published in the HUB as a good practice, according to the increasingly widespread of sharing scientific and educational open data.

Please apply the following step to add a case study:

- 1. Click on "new topic".
- 2. Insert a nickname of the student in the field "subject". Do not use nicknames that can disclose the real identity of the student. You are legally responsible for what you write!
- 3. Copy and paste the following structure of the case data in your topic:


and fill in these categories with the data of the student on which you want to work. You will be able to fill in the fields "Measure" and "Hypothesis of intervention" only after having discussed the case with the trainers.

The teachers will **debate** during the **training course** about the best **behavioral strategies** they would apply in the proposed case study.







As a result of the debate, teachers will define with trainers and peers the hypothesis of intervention to face the problem identified in the context.











The cases added in the BEHAVE application could be released anonymously as open data.
